The School Safety Net Project is a European project on Disseminating Best Practice in the area of Preventing School Dropout, funded by the European Commission under the Lifelong Learning Programme, Action KA4 (Project Number: 531028-LIP-1-2012-1-IT-KA4-KA4-089). If you are a teacher, a head teacher, a policy maker, a parent, a student or any other education stakeholder, you will find the ten-step guidelines stored in the database particularly useful to deal pragmatically with the problem of school dropout due to risk situations, learning difficulties, immigration or bullying – which are the four areas the project addresses. Should you like to go more in depth into any of the guidelines suggested, there are links to resources collected across several projects with open access to resources. The database also contains a collection of teachers' experiences connected by a European network of teachers. If you are a teacher you may be interested in exploring these to compare and contrast with your own experience. The next resource to be available (in October 2014) on the School Safety Net database will be case scenarios solved by visitors of European schools.
