- 5) Transnational comparative analysis of approaches

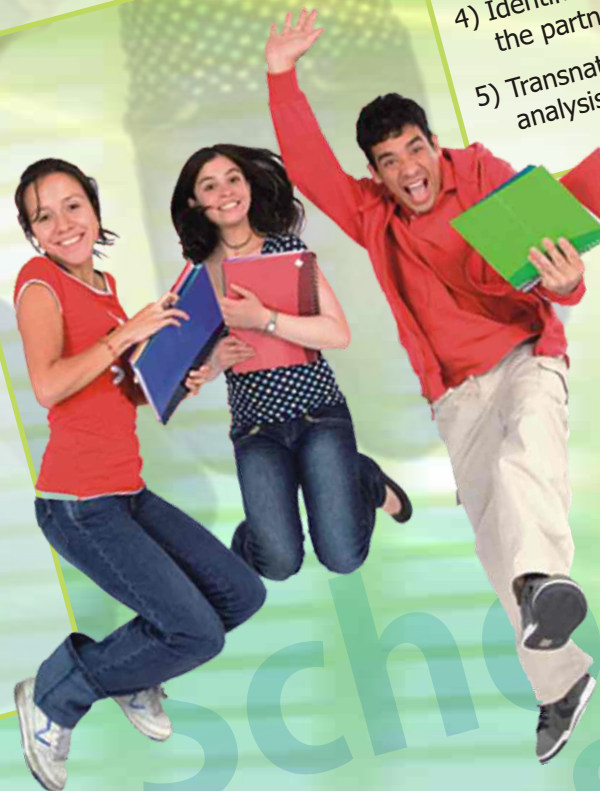
